We are happy to announce that as of February 1, 2024, the Eastern Partnership Regional Road Safety Observatory (EaPRSO) is up and running. The Technical Secretariat is led by the ISET Policy Institute and EASST (the Eastern Alliance for Safe & Sustainable Transport), and is located in Tbilisi, Georgia, at the ISET Policy Institute. This important regional endeavor, which is funded by the European Commission and supported by the World Bank, is dedicated to contributing swiftly and efficiently to the global target of reducing road traffic death and injury by 50% by 2030 across the five Eastern Partnership (EaP) countries – Armenia, Azerbaijan, Georgia, Moldova and Ukraine. To achieve this goal, the EaPRSO facilitates the sharing of best practice and the exchange of data to establish a robust foundation of evidence-based approaches to road safety. Its primary focus is on enhancing the capacity of EaP countries in data collection, reliability, and analysis, crucial for informing road safety policy development. More information about the Observatory and its activities is forthcoming, with an official launch event being planned for Spring 2024 in cooperation with the Georgia's Ministry of Economy and Sustainable Development
